# The Fallin Plan: Create Jobs and Restore Economic Prosperity to Oklahoma

- Reduce the tax burden on individuals and businesses to encourage job growth and investment

- Create a one stop shop for new businesses: top to bottom permitting and the ability to do so online

- Review and examine all tax credits on a cost-benefit basis and eliminate those that are not producing jobs and significant economic growth
- Remove burdensome regulations and reject new regulations that hinder job creation and growth
- Create a cabinet level position as an advocate for Small Businesses

- Fund the EDGE program, the state's primary engine for the support and growth of tech jobs
- Develop a Business Retention and Expansion program to assist companies already located in Oklahoma and provide them with the tools and assistance to help them thrive
- Incentivize rural investment to maximize opportunities and overcome challenges presented in non-metro areas
- Continue to support a robust Main Street Program to continue to enhance small towns in rural Oklahoma

- On Day One, ask each and every agency head to perform a full review of their operations, reevaluate their mission statements, explore modernization opportunities and justify every dollar spent
- Hold public meetings to get feedback from Oklahomans on the performance of state agencies
- Cut the size of government and remove duplicative and unnecessary regulations that impede job creation
- Reward state government employees for problem solving or cost saving ideas to be implemented in their agencies
- Sunset unnecessary boards and commissions
- Evaluate state assets and entities and privatize those that can better flourish in the private sector
- Establish standardized performance reviews of agencies.
- Increase accountability and transparency in government through better use of technology
- Protect the taxpayer by identifying and eliminating waste, fraud and abuse

### The Fallin Plan: Improve Schools Through Local Control, Incentives for Excellence and Smarter Spending

- Promote local control with transparency and accountability
- Empower parents and students through choice
- Promote performance based teacher pay to reward good teachers and hold those who consistently underperform accountable
- Continue alternative teacher certifications for industry specific programs – to increase the number of math and science teachers
- Identify ways to reduce administrative costs and direct more money into the classroom
- Expand online or virtual schools to increase the educational opportunities for rural Oklahoma
- Raise testing standards to ensure every student with a high school diploma is ready for the work force
- Encourage schools to implement more science, technology, engineering & math (STEM) into their curriculum to support a workforce in the new economy
- Work to prevent high school dropouts by identifying at-risk students and intervening early
- Integrate more technology into the classroom via virtual education
- Provide incentives to students to train in aviation and aerospace jobs to ensure a quality workforce for businesses in areas of potential growth
- Work with community colleges and the career tech system to ensure that rural Oklahomans are being trained for the jobs of the future
- Strengthen the rights of parents and local school boards in education

- Fight federal "cap and trade" legislation and its job-killing, \$500 billion tax on the energy industry
- Resist state and federal overregulation of energy interests which would stifle production
- Continue to encourage partnerships with the Noble Foundation and State Universities in areas such as biofuels development
- Support tax credits and incentives for production of alternative energies

As governor, I will continue to lead the charge against federal overreach and poorly conceived Washington schemes like Obamacare.

# The Fallin Plan: Fight Washington's Dangerous Policies, Reduce Costs in Oklahoma

- Oppose Obamacare and join the bipartisan lawsuit challenging the bill on constitutional grounds
- Incentivize health and wellness programs in businesses to encourage healthier lifestyles.
- Address fraud and abuse within the Medicaid system which wastes taxpayer dollars and drives up costs for everyone
- Provide incentives to doctors who stay in Oklahoma and practice in underserved and rural areas to ensure access to quality healthcare for all
- Enact lawsuit reform so that doctors can continue to practice in Oklahoma without malpractice rates forcing them to leave or limit their patients.
- Encourage the use of Health Savings Accounts
- Build on the success of Insure Oklahoma, a great program which has helped thousands of Oklahomans obtain affordable health insurance
- Maintain our commitment to OSU Medical Center in Tulsa
- Allow patients to purchase insurance across state lines to encourage competition and lower rates.

- Recognize the importance of the aviation industry to Oklahoma's economy and its potential for new jobs
- Work with the federal delegation to ensure affordable options for transit in urban as well as other areas of the state
- Use the Port of Catoosa, Port of Muskogee and the navigational system as an asset to recruit businesses

Illegal immigration is not something we can turn a blind eye to; it is a crime. I will enforce our laws, get tough on those who break them and make sure the rule of law is respected.
